2017 IN REVIEW

Reflecting back on 2017, we are humbled to know that God has used the Mission to administer to and provide services for both our homeless residents and community guests in need. Your monetary donations and hours of service have affected hundreds of men, women, and children in Hancock County. **This past year alone, City Mission has housed and provided meals for approximately 425 residents. Additionally, we have served about the same number of community guests who regularly rely on the food services that are available to the public.**

Not only have we had the opportunity to help individuals and families as an emergency shelter, providing an estimated 19,000 nights of lodging in 2017, but we also have staff available to connect our residents to necessary services in the Findlay and surrounding area. The Mission has tirelessly worked to build strong relationships with experts in the mental health and addiction field, adult probation and jail system, and employment and staffing industry. **Last year, we developed and cultivated partnerships with local businesses, organizations, and individuals who align with our organizational vision: To end homelessness one person at a time by constantly implementing new ways to help meet the needs of people.**

TRAVIS' STORY

Travis is originally from Van Buren, but came to the City Mission from the Toledo area. He was living on the street in the town square, night after night, until he sought refuge at a shelter. Meanwhile, he was in and out of the local stress center with a history of heart problems, and his doctor would not release him from the stress center until he had a place to live. He did his research and found that space was available at the City Mission of Findlay.

Prior to coming to the Mission, Travis had applied several times for disability income but had been declined. He was not able to find part-time or full-time employment because of his declining health, part of which included being declared legally blind because of eye cataracts. To make matters worse, living in the streets made Travis feel unsafe and unclean.

During his stay at City Mission, Travis was able to improve his health, set life goals, and find a sense of purpose. He had eye surgery to correct his cataracts, found a job working seven days a week, and plans to move to California in the future. He is very appreciative of the City Mission staff and those that have come along side of him in support.
